## Committed to the Future of Our Community—PCH Awaits State Approval for Major Expansion Plan



Pana Community Hospital is building for the future by continuing plans to expand the physical facility. Pana Community Hospital has been working closely with Farnsworth Group—an architect/engineer firm and O'Shea Builders as project construction manager.

The project is designed in two phases. Phase I of the proposed project will provide additional space for a new surgical suite, laboratory, diagnostic imaging, cardiopulmonary, materials management and dietary departments. Phase II of the project will create additional space for urgent care, improve access to the hospital building, and provide a contemporary waiting area with private registration offices.

physical therapy," stated Crystal. Carlee is also grateful for the care she received at PCH. "I didn't have to miss much school because I was able to get all my care in Pana. The PCH staff




# Committed to Our Community — Impacting our Economy

**Total Hospital Visits and Hospital Owned Clinic Visits**




## Patient Care

## Pana Community Hospital Emergency Department — Committed to Our Patients!

Pana Community Hospital's Emergency Department has been providing life-saving emergency care to Pana and the surrounding communities for over 100 years—24 hours a day, 365 days per year. Since the beginning, we have always been prepared to care for patients when an emergency strikes. Our emergency department prides itself on being **prompt, skilled, and compassionate!**

### PROMPT

Staff in the ER evaluate a patient's condition immediately and offer PROMPT care. The average wait time to be assessed is 10 minutes or less! Traveling long distances for emergency care can be the difference between life and death. If someone is having chest pain, showing signs of a stroke, or needs trauma care, those extra 15-20 minutes can be life threatening.

### SKILLED

The Medical Director of the Emergency Department has been serving Pana Community Hospital for 18 years. The ER nursing staff has an average of 15-20 years experience. Staff are highly trained in emergency care and certified in Trauma Care, Neonatal/Pediatric Resuscitation, and Advanced Cardiac Life Support for adults and children. The Emergency Department is Stat Stroke and Stat Heart prepared. PCH was one of the first hospitals to partner with Prairie Heart Institute to become a Stat Heart hospital, attaining an expected average time of 30 minutes from ED door to seeing a Cardiologist in Springfield.

### COMPASSIONATE

A trip to the ER can often be very stressful. PCH staff prides itself on the compassionate care we give each and every patient. Whether it's calming a scared child who is about to receive stitches, offering a warm blanket to a sick patient, or consoling a family member in one of their saddest hours, we have always been here when you needed us most. ♥
